

A ground-breaking UK coalition of offshore oil and gas workers, climate groups and trade unions are backing a new plan that would deliver a fair transition away from fossil fuels to protect jobs, communities and climate, according to **Friends of the Earth**, Scotland.

Over 1000 surveyed oil and gas workers supported the demands to remove barriers to transitioning into renewables; to ensure improved safety, job security and fair pay across the energy industry.

End Exploitation!

Research exposes the extent of exploitation and exclusion from decision-making endemic in the offshore UK oil and gas industry. In the face of political inaction, workers are ready to lead the transfer away from fossil fuels. Costed demands include a permanent Energy Excess Profits tax, a sovereign wealth fund, public ownership, rig decommissioning costs to be paid for by polluting companies, and a minimum wage for migrant workers.



SPREADING THE STRIKES – STOPPING ANY RETREATS

The cost-of-living-crisis and climate crisis are linked - extreme weather causing food shortages and transport dislocation now. Workers deserve and need above-inflation wage increases to manage the spiralling costs of food, fuel & housing. 
