Britain has experienced two-thirds of total average annual rainfall in just the first three months. Along with the changing weather patterns, erratic seasons and temperature anomalies there should be no doubt that climate change is happening.

Most people are now worried about climate change. Yet politicians, in tandem with the executives of corporations dependent upon fossil fuels, are pulling back on almost all action to stop emissions and are actively preventing investments in adaptations to stop climate chaos.

We can see the disruption from extreme weather conditions, droughts and fires, floods and sea levels rising, sudden shifts in temperatures, and food price rises caused by poor harvests and transport disruption. Climate Change has even slowed the speed of the earth's rotation! We need action to prevent climate catastrophe.


