

Unprecedented heatwaves are becoming more frequent across the globe and are increasingly affecting workers in their work environment. There are no laws on maximum workplace temperatures or provision for heat furlough, but we are likely to need those urgently. In some countries, heatwaves have led to the death of workers either in the outdoors or in extremely hot workplaces.

Carbon Dioxide increase in density in the atmosphere - pre-industrial = 350ppm

Global heating is caused by the increasing concentration of gases in Earth's atmosphere, including Carbon Dioxide (CO₂), Methane and Nitrous Oxide being released by the burning of fossil fuels. The gases cannot escape, and trap heat, causing extreme weather conditions, ice melt and ocean expansion - rising sea levels.

Global Heating

The parts-per-million (ppm) of CO₂ in the atmosphere may appear small but measure stability and change. For more than 2 million years, CO₂ ppm has been between 300-350. Emissions have risen to increase this to 429 in March 2024 - an increase of one-third, causing huge increases in global heating and dramatic climate changes. We have to stop burning fossil fuels and cut emissions to zero to prevent climate chaos and social collapse.
